

These lyrics were written in song by Hal Davis in 1965. The sentiments were true then and remain true today. We live in a world filled with anger, fear, and persecution – of all varieties. #### **BEFORE SCHOOL**

# ACT Aspire Assessment Test—FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORES, April 29 OR May 2. These are REMOTE LEARNING days for JUNIORS and SENIORS.

#### Freshmen and Sophomores will be tested in 2 groups:

<u>Friday, April 29</u>—Freshmen and Sophomores, Last Names A—J.

(<u>All</u> other students have a remote learning day)

Monday, May 2—Freshmen and Sophomores, Last Names K—Z.

(All other students have a remote learning day)

Students should arrive at 7:45am and report to testing rooms (assignments will be posted by the Advising Office).

Testing begins promptly at 8am.

Student dismissal at 1pm. Please arrange rides (busses will be notified).

\*No lunch will be served; snacks will be provided.

ACT Aspire® is an online summative assessment that measures what students have learned in the areas of: English, Reading, Math, Science, and Writing. ACT Aspire® scores predict how a student will perform on the ACT when they reach 11th grade. By taking this assessment, students who need academic interventions or challenges can be identified earlier in their high school careers.

Students must arrive to Prom in dress code, or they will be turned away without a refund. Doors open at 6:00pm, and all students must arrive by 6:30pm. Late arrivals will be turned away without a refund. Prom ends at 11:00pm, and students may not leave until 10:30pm.

  - Be sure to write the first and last name for both you and your date (if applicable) in the required spot. If someone's name is not on the list, they will not be admitted to the dance.
- Follow the prompts to purchase your ticket(s)


