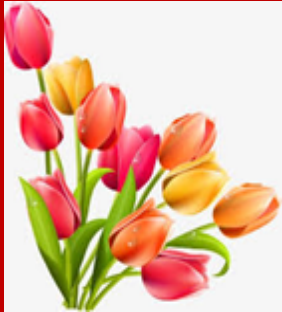

FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

God sends us to Love God

As we continue to examine our Calling, in light of the theme verse for the year from Isaiah 6:8, the final weeks of the year present how we are to live out our calling. We have seen where the Calling originated (God), the individuals to whom the Calling was presented (Us), and to whom it was to go (our World). Finally, in the last few weeks we examine the actions that we take as faithful recipients of that Call.

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. (Deuteronomy 6:5)

Worship the Lord your God and serve him only. (Luke 4:8)

These two verses hold the key about what it means to Love God with our whole heart. There can be nothing that supersedes our relationship with our Heavenly Father. This morning in chapel we examined the commandments. The first commandment is the most important in our understanding of loving God – “You shall have no other gods before Me.” (Exodus 20). Anytime we allow someone or something to become most important in our life we displace God into a secondary spot.

God commands that He is to remain first in our lives. At times, this seems like a selfish and greedy demand. Instead, He knows that keeping Him first prioritizes our lives for our own good. This allows us to avoid many pitfalls and dangers that would not benefit us physically, emotionally, or spiritually. We seek first His kingdom, rather than the desires of our flesh. He calls us to first Love Him.

BEFORE SCHOOL

ACT Aspire Assessment Test—FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORES, April 29 OR May 2.

These are REMOTE LEARNING days for JUNIORS and SENIORS.

Freshmen and Sophomores will be tested in 2 groups:

Friday, April 29—Freshmen and Sophomores, Last Names A—J.

(All other students have a remote learning day)

Monday, May 2—Freshmen and Sophomores, Last Names K—Z.

(All other students have a remote learning day)

Students should arrive at 7:45am and report to testing rooms (assignments will be posted by the Advising Office).

Testing begins promptly at 8am.

Student dismissal at 1pm. Please arrange rides (busses will be notified).

****No lunch will be served; snacks will be provided.***

ACT Aspire® is an online summative assessment that measures what students have learned in the areas of: English, Reading, Math, Science, and Writing. ACT Aspire® scores predict how a student will perform on the ACT when they reach 11th grade. By taking this assessment, students who need academic interventions or challenges can be identified earlier in their high school careers.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES . . .

Prom 2022: Prom is Saturday, May 7th, at the Mitchell Park Domes. Prom ticket sales begin on Monday, April 11th, and close on Friday, April 24th. No tickets will be sold after 4/24. Tickets cost \$60 and will be sold exclusively through eFunds. MLHS students must complete a parent permission form by 4/24 in order to attend Prom. Permission form can be found here: <https://forms.office.com/r/PvqL5eagrj>. Guests attending a different high school must complete a Guest Pass, which can be obtained in the Main Office. These must be placed in Miss Vonderheide's mailbox by 4/24.

Students must arrive to Prom in dress code, or they will be turned away without a refund. Doors open at 6:00pm, and all students must arrive by 6:30pm. Late arrivals will be turned away without a refund. Prom ends at 11:00pm, and students may not leave until 10:30pm.

- Select "Login", "Create Account", or "Continue as Guest" and follow the prompts
 - If needed, the 5-digit "student number" can be found in Skyward under Student Info - Other ID or on the student's school-issued ID
- Select "One Ticket" or "Two Tickets" depending on if you are buying a ticket for just you or you and your date
 - Be sure to write the first and last name for both you and your date (if applicable) in the required spot. If someone's name is not on the list, they will not be admitted to the dance.
- Follow the prompts to purchase your ticket(s)

Senior Farewell: Seniors, save the date! This year's Senior Farewell will take place at Dave and Busters on Friday, May 20th, from 6-9pm.
