Harmony through Kindness and Compassion

Thus says the Lord of hosts, Render true judgments, show kindness and mercy to one another. (Zechariah 7:9)

Each of us likely was taught some version of the Golden Rule as we were growing up. Treat others how you want to be treated. Do unto others as you would want them to do to you. Whatever language was learned, the concept is universal – treat others with kindness and compassion because that is how most of us would want to be treated.

The unbeliever, as well as the believer, can treat people kindly. While this seems like just a worldly accepted concept, as Christians we understand that the foundation for our compassion is based on something greater than ourselves – or our neighbor. November 7, 7:45am—11:30am: FR, SO, JR testing (*Seniors, no school*)

Freshmen and Juniors will take the pre ACT. The PreACT is a slightly shorter, slightly easier exam designed to help students prepare for the official ACT exam by simulating the test and testing experience. The PreACT is a paper-and-pencil test comprised of multiple-choice sections for English, Math, Reading, and Science. The PreACT provides you and your student with information that can help you select the right high school courses, think about ways to target areas for improvement, and even begin discussions about college and career options. Results will be available in January.

**Students should plan to bring a calculator and #2 pencil.*

Sophomores will take the ASVAB. The ASVAB, or Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery, is sponsored by the Department of Defense and is a test that measures abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. It is also a highly effective career exploration exam for those students not wishing to enter the military, but hoping to figure out the best career pathway available to them.

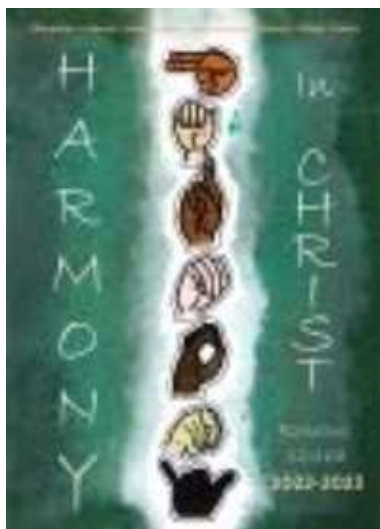
