# AFTER SCHOOL PICK-UP

With the cold weather (and snow) setting in, please remember that students have one of two choices after 4:00 pm on regular school days in terms of dismissal from school. At 4:00 pm students must either leave

campus or report to the cafeteria. If choosing to go to the cafeteria, students will need to pay \$8 (on a daily basis) for supervision. Such supervision ends at 4:40 pm, at which point students must also leave campus.

We ask that MLHS' willingness to allow students to remain on campus for the 40 minutes from the end of school (3:20 pm - 4:00 pm) not be taken advantage of. Students who can leave campus immediately at 3:20 pm should do so. Likewise, students who are driven home, drive home, walk home, or Uber home should also make every effort to leave campus as closely to 3:20 pm as possible.

# ACADEMIC UPDATE

# First Semester Exams

A few reminders about exam week:

- Students are expected to be in dress code.
- No breakfast or lunch will be served on exam days.
- All classes will conduct final exams, projects, or activities. Student attendance is required for all classes. There are two exceptions: 1. If a student has a Study Hall scheduled for the first or last exam of the day, attendance is not required. 2. If a student has a scheduled Early Release, attendance is not required for those periods. Students who elect to not attend due to one of these reasons must be off campus, and therefore will not be under MLHS supervision. As a reminder, students who are on campus must attend scheduled classes/study halls.
- Students must take care of any financial obligations prior to taking their first final each day. Students should check the lists posted outside the main office to see if they owe any money.

#### Milwaukee Lutheran Home Game Protocols and Procedures

All tickets must be purchased ahead of time at <u>http://spicket.events/mlhs-</u> <u>redknights</u> or on the Ticket Spicket app (Orange app with a Capital T and a Football, Basketball, and Volleyball coming off the letter T). **No cash will be accepted at the gate.** 

- 1. Click on the event you would like to attend.
- 2. Select Buy Tickets and select the total number of tickets purchased.
- 3. Click on Checkout (please note that if this is the first time using Ticket Spicket, you will need to register for a new account).
- 4. Confirm the total is correct. The system will ask you to select Checkout again.
- After you pay for your tickets, look into the option on the top of your screen labeled MY TICKETS. Otherwise you can click the blue button that is labeled VIEW MY TICKETS AND PASSES.
- 6. Click on the ticket you purchased.
- 7. Click on VIEW TICKETS then the ticket itself. When the gate is open, you will be able to click on a green button that is labeled CHECK-IN OR REDEEM TICKET.

Ticket sales will open four days prior to each event and close at 2:00pm the day of the game. Any individual(s) not purchasing tickets by 2:00pm will not be allowed into the game.

Tickets can be printed at home to be scanned at the event or shown in the Ticket Spicket app on cellular devices to be scanned. NO SCREENSHOTS ACCEPTED.

Gates/entrance open 30 minutes before the scheduled start time of the lower-level event. Gates/entrance will lock 30 minutes after the start of the Varsity contest. Anyone not in the game by this time will not be allowed in.

Refunds will only be issued for ticket purchases if the event is canceled.

No re-entry to the event. Once you leave you will not be allowed to go back in.

All middle/elementary school students must be with an adult.

Woodland Conference officials passes are still allowed at the gate for Woodland Conference games only, No digital ticket required.

Red Knight students will need to have a wristband, student ID card, and digital ticket to enter each contest.

The price for student yearbooks this year is \$60 until October 27. After October 27, the price will go up to \$68. You must order your yearbook online and follow the below instructions:

- 1. Go to this website: www.jostenyearbooks.com
- 2. Click on "Choose Your School".
- 3. Choose/type in Milwaukee Lutheran as your school.
- 4. Once you have Milwaukee Lutheran chosen, go to the tab labeled, "2024 Yearbooks."
- 5. There are several options listed. Please choose the "Yearbook- \$60" option. There is also another option to add the "Signature Package". This is an extra cost but it includes: personalization, color autograph section, and colored markers for signing.
- Add either option to your cart and follow the prompts to complete your order and proceed to checkout. You can add personalization & ICONS as well.
- You can choose to spread out your payments for the yearbook. You will be able to make 3 equal payments over 3 months to help make the book more affordable if you choose to do so.

Our school utilizes the SchoolMessenger system to deliver text messages, straight to your mobile phone with important information about events, school closings, safety alerts and more.

You can participate in this free service\* just by sending a text message of "Y" or "Yes" to our school's short code number, 67587.

You can also opt out of these messages at any time by simply replying to one of our messages with "Stop".

We recommend saving this short code and Caller ID to the contacts on your phone. This will help prevent any 3rd party call blocking systems from interfering with your receipt of important messages sent by the school or district.



SchoolMessenger is compliant with the Student Privacy Pledge<sup>TM</sup>, so you can rest assured that your information is safe and will never be given or sold to anyone.

Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes: SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message". Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers.

If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.


